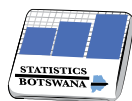




Statistical Year Book 2017

The economic Statistics presented covers; National Accounts, Prices, Trade, Tourism, Agriculture, Industry, Environment, Wildlife and Transport & Infrastructure. It contains a summary of key economic and social indicators for Botswana.

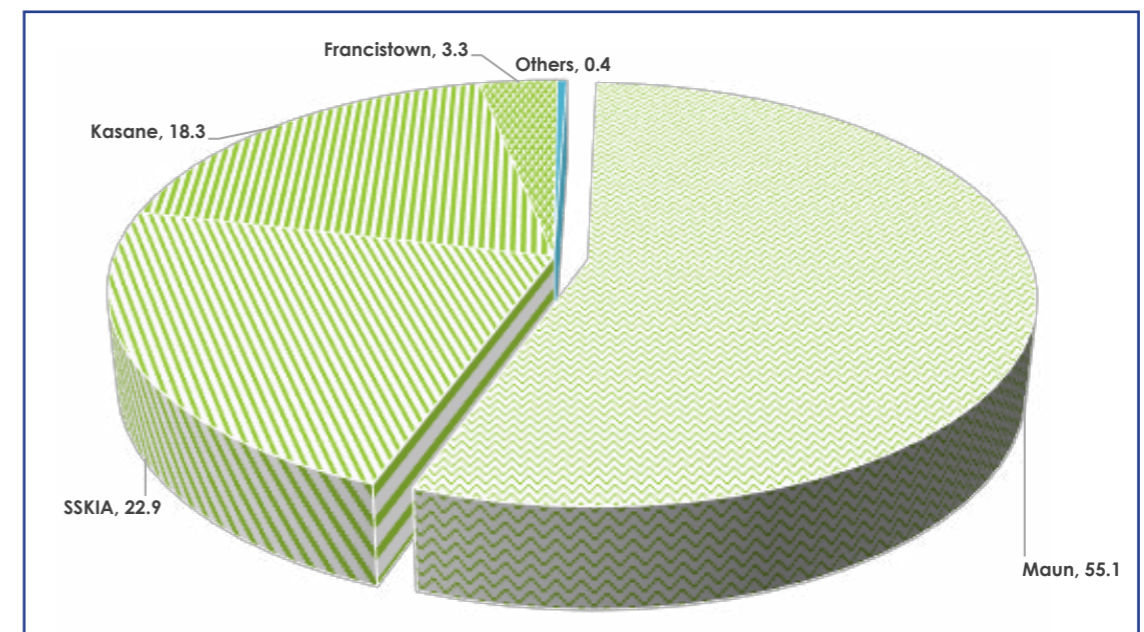
Transport

Air Transport

Aircraft movements declined by 9.6 percent in 2017, from 77,079 movements recorded in 2016 to 69,716 movements registered in 2017. The decrease was realized in both international (4.9 percent) and domestic movements (11.1 percent). International private movements increased by 15.7 percent and domestic private movements increased by 9.7 percent.

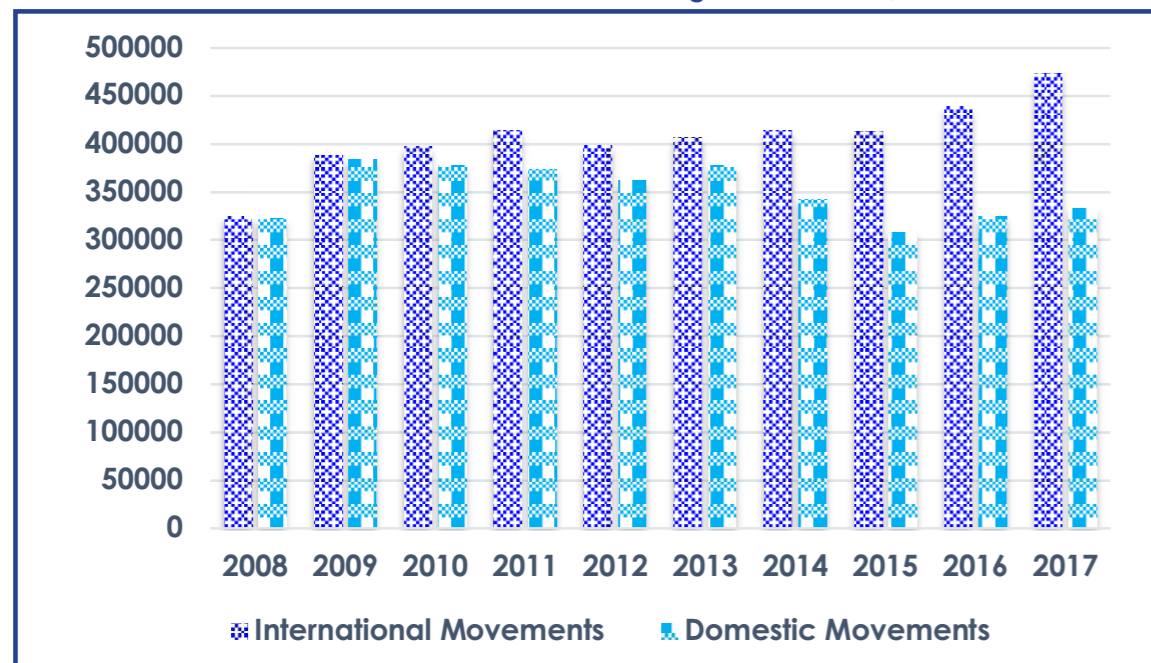
FIGURE 1: Aircraft Movements in Percentage by Airport, 2017

Two airports experienced an increase in aircraft movements in 2017, namely Selebi Phikwe (25.2 percent) and Kasane (5.9 percent). The other four airports registered a decline in aircraft movements with the highest decrease being in Ghanzi (15.9 percent). Ghanzi was followed by Maun with 14.2 percent and Sir Seretse Khama International Airport (SSKIA) experienced the least decrease with 8.4 percent. Maun accounted for 55.1 percent of total aircraft movements registered in 2017. This is justifiable as Maun is a tourist destination, and as such receives most of non-scheduled aircrafts. Sir Seretse Khama International Airport (SSKIA) accounted for 22.9 percent of total aircraft movements. The airports that had the least number of movements was Selebi Phikwe and Ghanzi with 0.2 percent each of total aircraft movements. See **Figure 1** below.

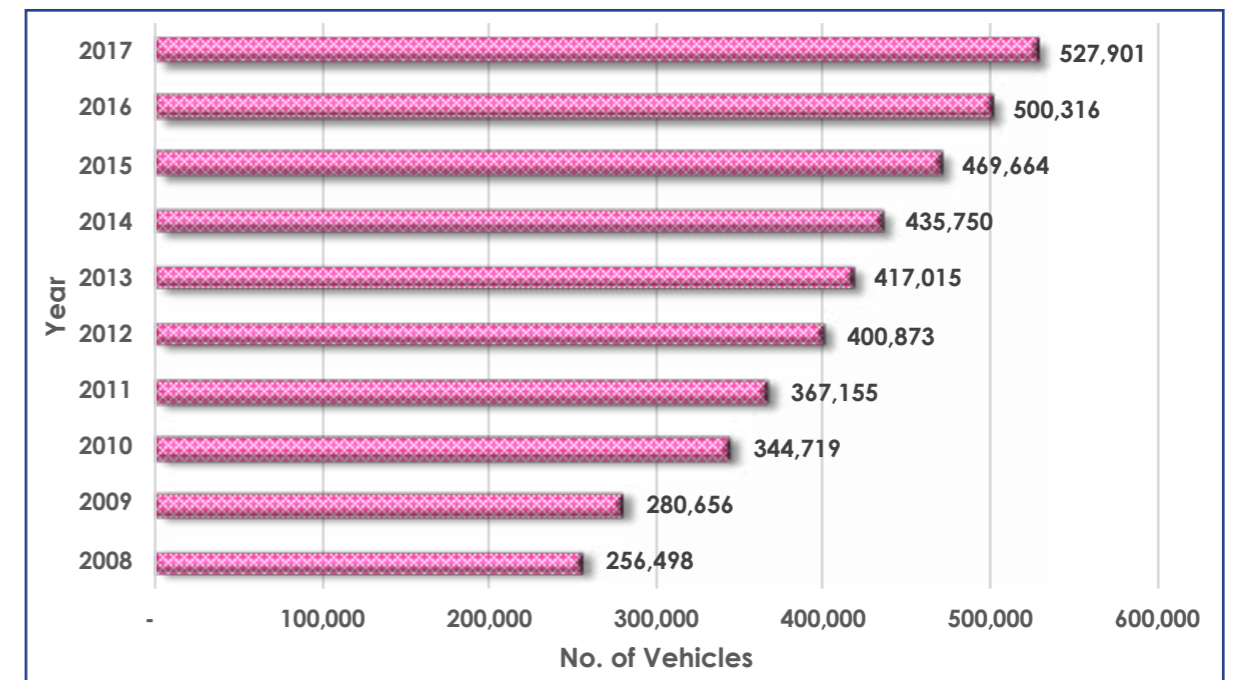
FIGURE 2: International and Domestic Passenger Movements, 2008-2017

Though aircraft movements declined in 2017. There was an increase of 5.6 percent in air passenger movements compared to 2016. Both the international and domestic movements recorded an increase of 7.9 and 2.5 percent respectively. SSKIA contributed 52.6 percent of total air passenger traffic, while Maun made the second highest contribution of 30.7 percent. The airport which contributed the least number of air passenger traffic was Ghanzi with 0.03 percent. In 2017, three airports namely SSKIA, Kasane and Maun realized an increase in passenger movements, while the other three airports experienced a decline in passenger movements. SSKIA passenger movements increased by 5.4 percent, Kasane increased by 10.5 percent while Maun went up by 7.0 percent. Francistown passenger movements went down by 9.9 percent, the airport that experienced the most decline was Ghanzi with 49.8 percent. All air passenger traffic types realized an increase in 2017, with international arrivals and departures increasing by 7.2 and 8.6 percent respectively. Domestic air passenger arrivals and departures increased by 2.4 and 2.5 percent respectively. Details are shown in **Figure 2** below.

Road Transport National Vehicle Stock

The number of licensed vehicles in Botswana increased by 5.5 percent from 500,316 vehicles in 2016 to 527,901 vehicles in 2017. National vehicle stock grew at an annual rate of 9.7 percent from 2008 to 2017. Most of these vehicles were passenger cars (62.2 percent). This is shown in **Figure 3** below.

FIGURE 3: National Vehicle Stock, 2008-2017

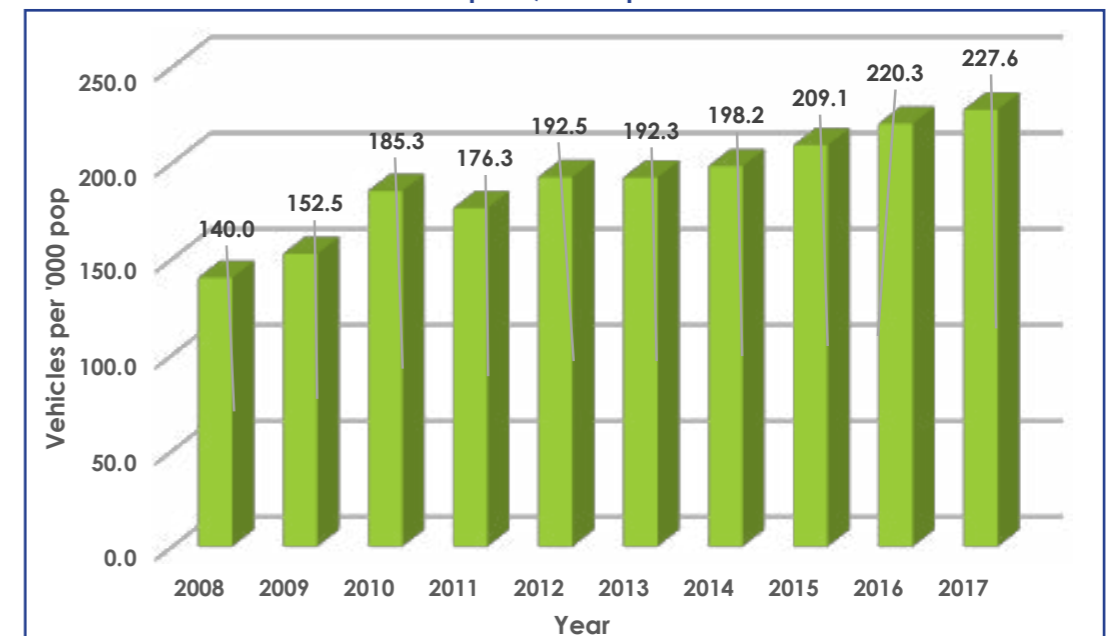


Private Vehicle Stock

In 2017, total privately owned vehicles went up from 487,523 in 2016, to 515,370 in 2017, which was an increase of 5.7 percent. This increase can be attributed to the growth in trucks (62.4 percent) and passenger cars which went up by 8.3 percent. Passenger cars and vans made up 63.2 and 20.0 percent of the total of privately owned vehicles. Three categories of vehicles experienced a slump, the most notable decline was in Buses which went down by 79.2 percent. Buses were followed by motor cycles which went down by 22.8 percent while vans declined by 0.9 percent.

Vehicles per 1,000 population was 227.6 in 2017, an increase of 3.3 percent from 220.3 vehicles in 2016. As the private vehicle population continues to grow, it negatively affects public transport. This means strategies should be put in place to make public transport more attractive, e.g. by creating lanes solely dedicated for public transport. This is shown in **Figure 4** below.

Rail Transport

Passengers transported using rail in 2017 were 134,702, which was a 23.3 percent increase compared to 2016. Out of the passengers transported using rail in 2017, 11.5 percent used sleeper class, 15.1 percent used business class while 73.4 percent used standard class. In 2017 P15, 151 million was generated in the transportation of passengers.

In 2017, goods transported through rail declined by 25.0 percent from 2,057,402 net tonnes in 2016 to 1,542,519 net tonnes in 2017. All categories of goods traffic went down except imports from North which increased by 27.1 percent. A significant drop was realized in transit traffic which went down by 73.0 percent from 415,300 net tonnes carried in 2016 to 112,000 tonnes carried in 2017. Total imports slipped by 21.8 percent, exports to North fell by 25.7 percent while local traffic went down by 20.8 percent. This is shown in **Figure 5** and **Table A** below.

FIGURE 5: Rail Goods Traffic by Direction, 2008-2017

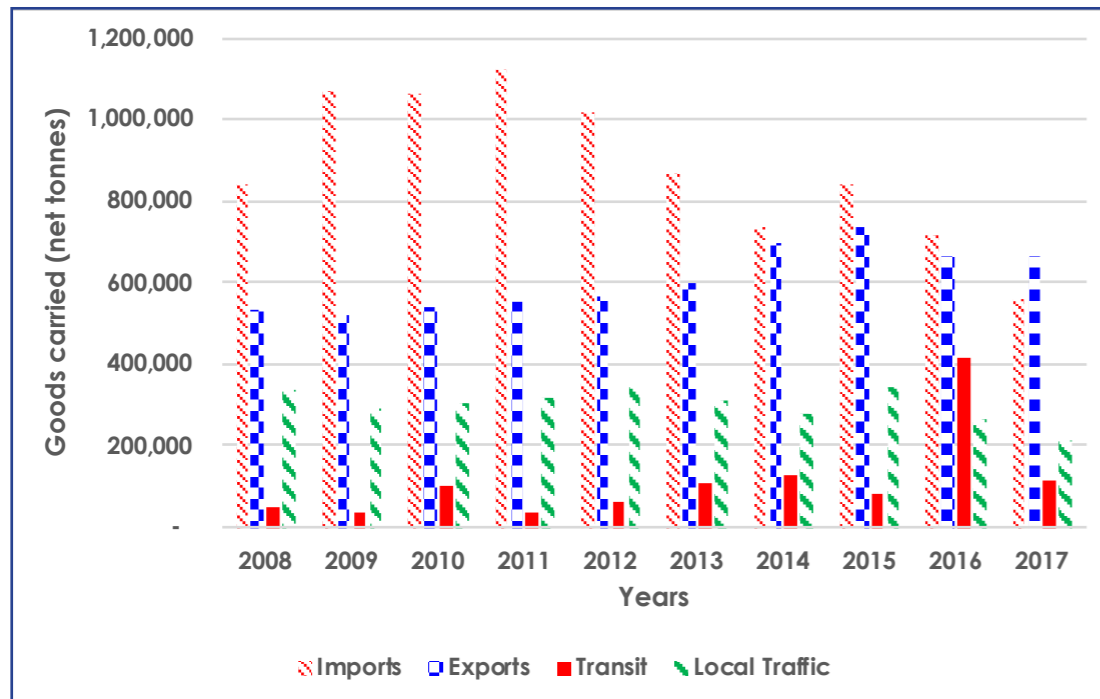

In 2017, the number of people who used the Kazungula Pontoon to either cross in or out of Botswana was 484,023, which was a decline of 3.7 percent in 2016. Most of the people who used the Pontoon in 2017 were foreigners (74.3 percent) while 25.7 percent were Botswana citizens. Out of total number of foreigners, 53.3 percent were arrivals into Botswana while 46.72 percent were departing from Botswana. For Batswana 51.0 percent were arrivals while 49.0 percent were departing. See Table B above.

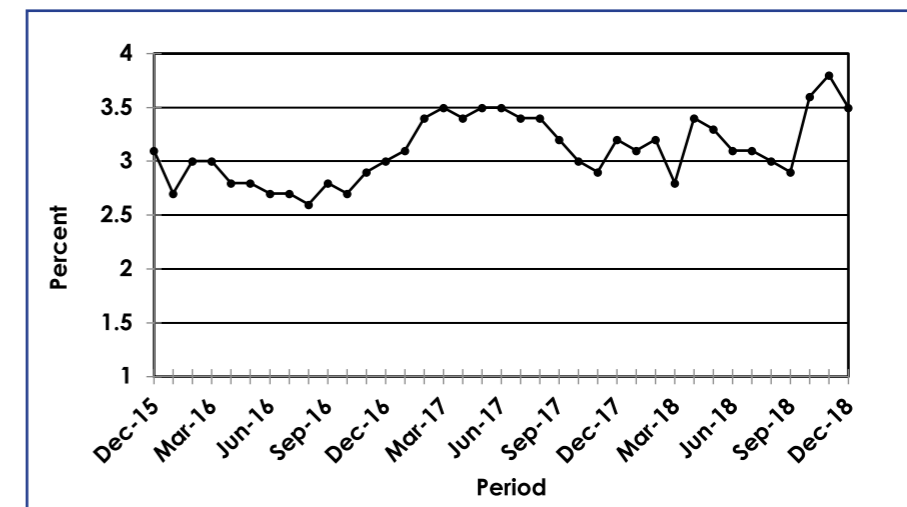

There were 54,955 vehicles transported using the Pontoon in 2017, which was a 13.0 percent decrease over the 63,138 vehicles transported in 2017. Fifty six point seven (56.7 percent) of these vehicles were leaving the country while 43.3 percent were entering the country. Compared to 2016, the number of vehicles leaving the country declined by 21.3 percent and those entering the country decreased by 5.3 percent. The number of vehicles using the Pontoon mostly decreased in the five years, except in 2014 when they increased. The decline was noted in both vehicles going out of the country and coming in. See Table C above.

Consumer Price Index (CPI)

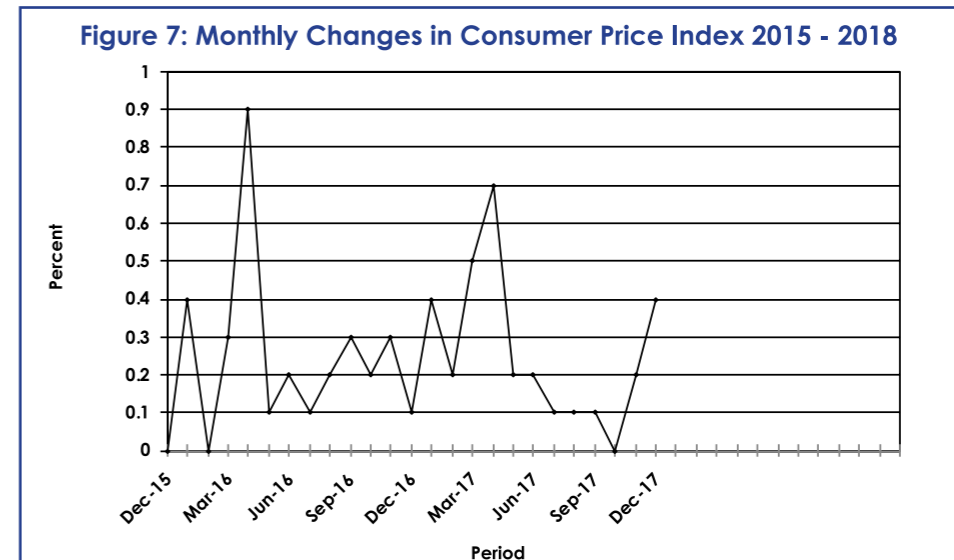
Information on Consumer Price Index is summarized on Tables 2.3.1 through 2.3.5 The national year-on-year inflation rate for the entire 2018 was 3.2 percent on average as opposed to the 2017 figure of 3.3 percent. There was an increase in the national inflation rate from 3.1 percent in January to 3.5 percent in December 2018. The cities/towns' inflation rate increased from 3.6 percent to 4.2 percent between January and December 2018. The urban villages' inflation rates also rose from 2.9 to 3.5 percent, while the rural villages' rate dropped from 2.8 to 2.5 percent, during January and December 2018.

FIGURE 6: National Inflation Rate 2015 - 2018



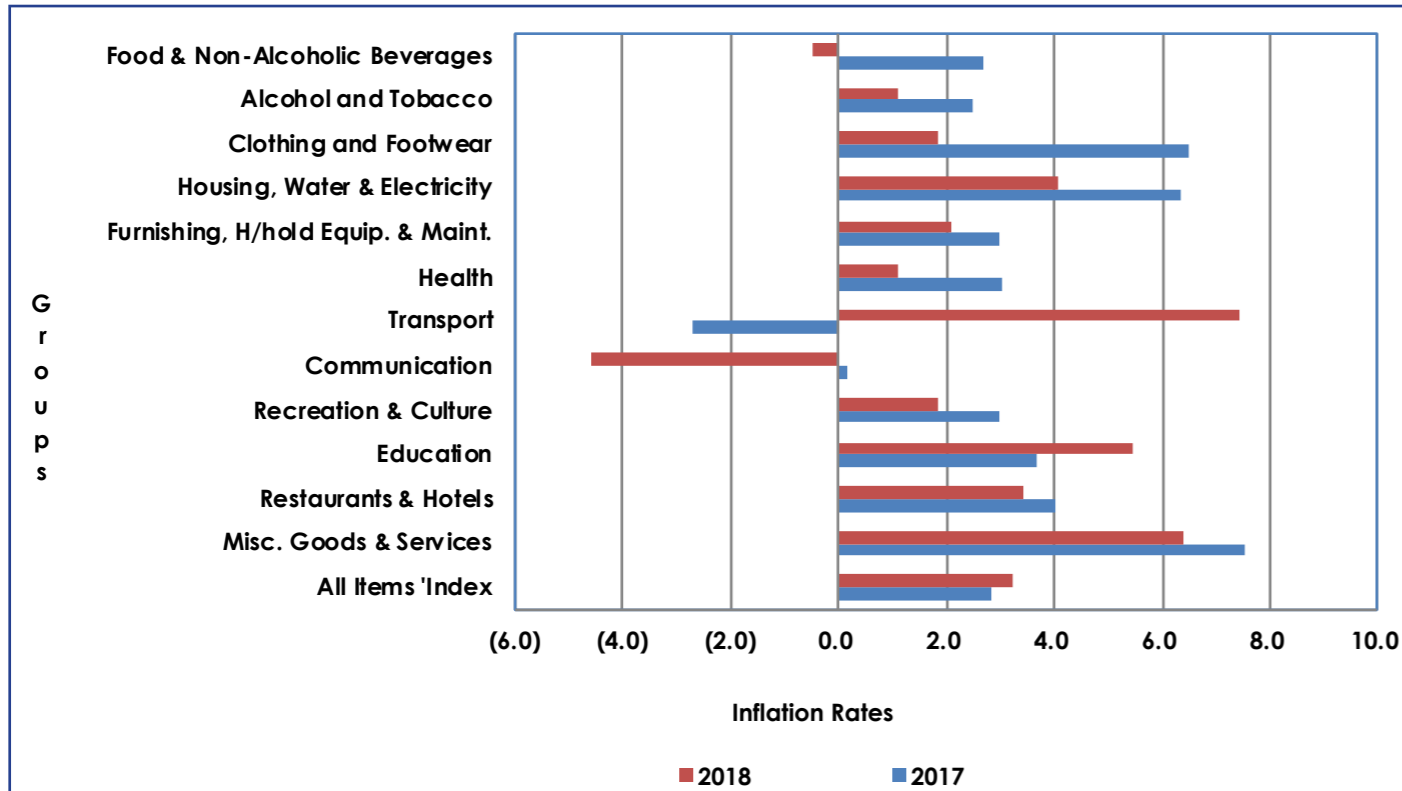
The National Consumer Price index increased from 104.1 to 107.4 between January and December 2018 showing an increase of 3.1 percent over the two periods. This compares with an increase of 2.8 percent from 101.0 to 103.7 during the same period of the previous year. The cities/towns, urban villages and rural indices rose from 104.5 to 108.4, 103.7 to 106.9 and 104.1 to 106.4, respectively between January and December 2018.

Average inflation rate for Transport group Index increased by 5.9 percentage points from 1.6 percent in 2017 to 7.5 percent in 2018. Communication group Index had the lowest inflation rate in 2018 at negative 4.6 percent.

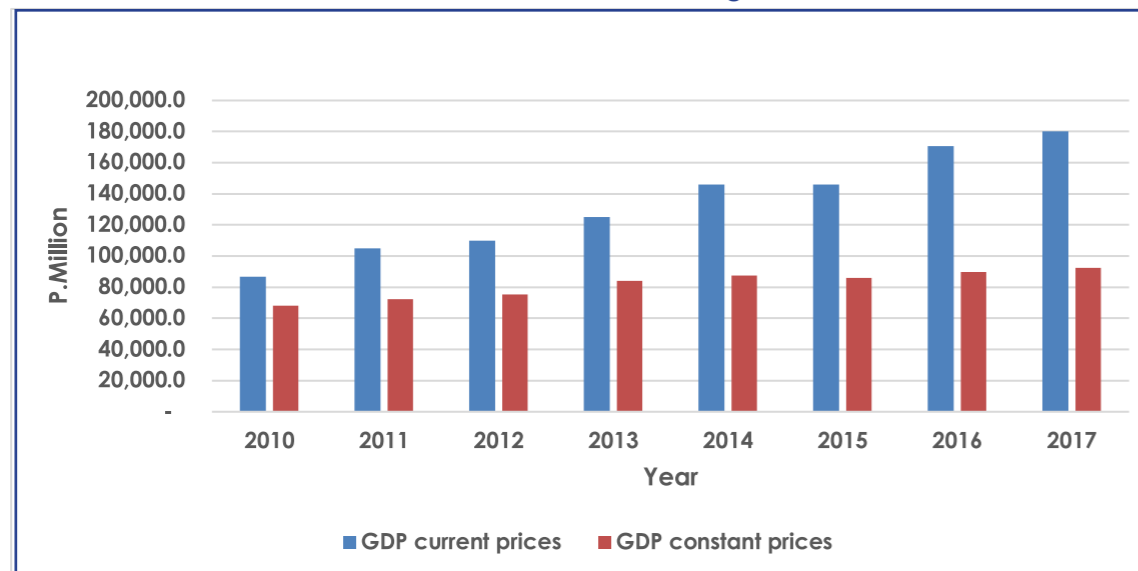
FIGURE 8: Comparison of average inflation rates for various commodities in 2017 and 2018



Gross Domestic Product (GDP)

GDP at nominal prices for 2017 is estimated at P180, 102.1 million, compared with a revised estimate of P170, 563.7 million in 2016, which is a 5.6 percent increase. At current prices, GDP per capita increased from a revised estimate of P76, 840.9 in 2016 to P79, 903.2 in 2017, which is an increase of 4.0 percent. At constant 2006 prices, GDP was estimated at P92, 398.0 million in 2017, an increase of 2.9 percent from the previous year. GDP per capita increased from P40, 450.2 in 2016 to P40, 992.9 in 2017, showing increase of 1.5 percent in real terms.

GDP by Economic activity

Real GDP increased by 2.9 percent in 2017 compared to 4.3 percent increase in 2016. The increase in real GDP was mainly attributed to Water & Electricity, Trade, Hotels & Restaurants, and Transport & communications industries which recorded an increase in value added of 39.9, 9.0, and 4.7 percent respectively. 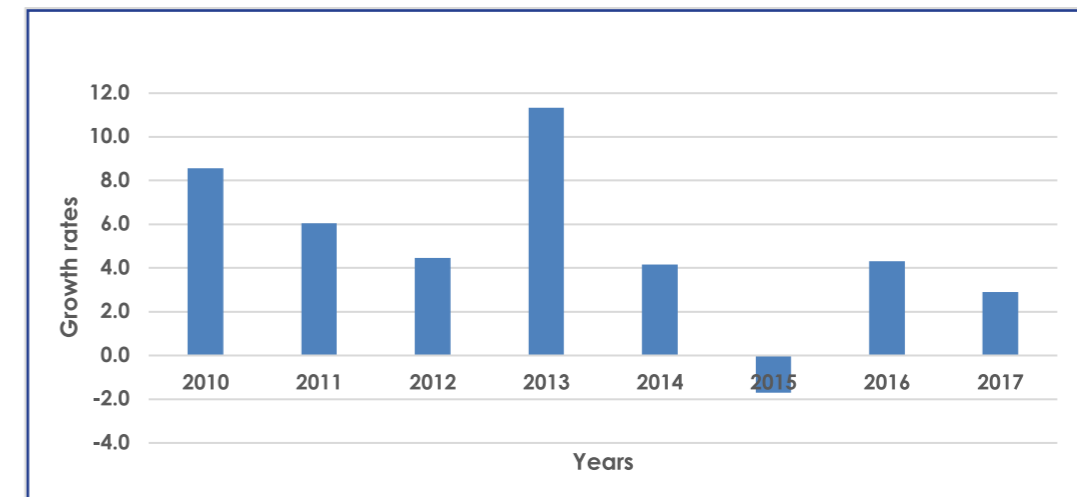
Trade, Hotels & Restaurants increase in real value added of 9.0 percent is attributed to the wholesale sub industry which comprises of the downstream diamond industries. In 2017, the wholesale value added increased by 25.9 percent compared to 74.1 percent increase registered in 2016. During 2017, diamond prices remained relatively stable.

Water and Electricity value added at constant 2006 prices for the year 2017 was P872.0 million compared to P623.2 million registered in the previous year, recording an increase of 39.9 percent. In 2017, Electricity recorded a negative value added of P38.0 million compared to a negative value added of P183.1 million registered in the previous year. The improvement in the Electricity real value added is attributed to an increase in local electricity production by 17.9 percent and a decrease of 42.7 percent in electricity imports.

A decrease of 11.1 percent in the real value added of the Mining sector was mainly due to Copper/Nickel and Soda Ash value added which declined by 98.8 and 22.6 percent respectively. BCL and Tati Nickel copper mines were placed under provisional liquidation in October 2016. Soda Ash production in tonnes decreased by 20.0 percent because the mine was put under care and maintenance during the second quarter of 2017. During the year under review, diamond value added increased by 9.9 percent.

Contribution to GDP by industry is shown in table 2.mIn 2017, Trade, Hotels & Restaurants and Mining industries remained major contributors to GDP, their contributions stood at 19.5 percent and 17.4 percent respectively.

HIGHLIGHTS OF MINERAL PRODUCTION STATISTICS IN 2017

The index of mineral production stood at 84.7 in 2017 as compared to 83.1 registered in 2016, showing an increase of 2 percent in the overall production.

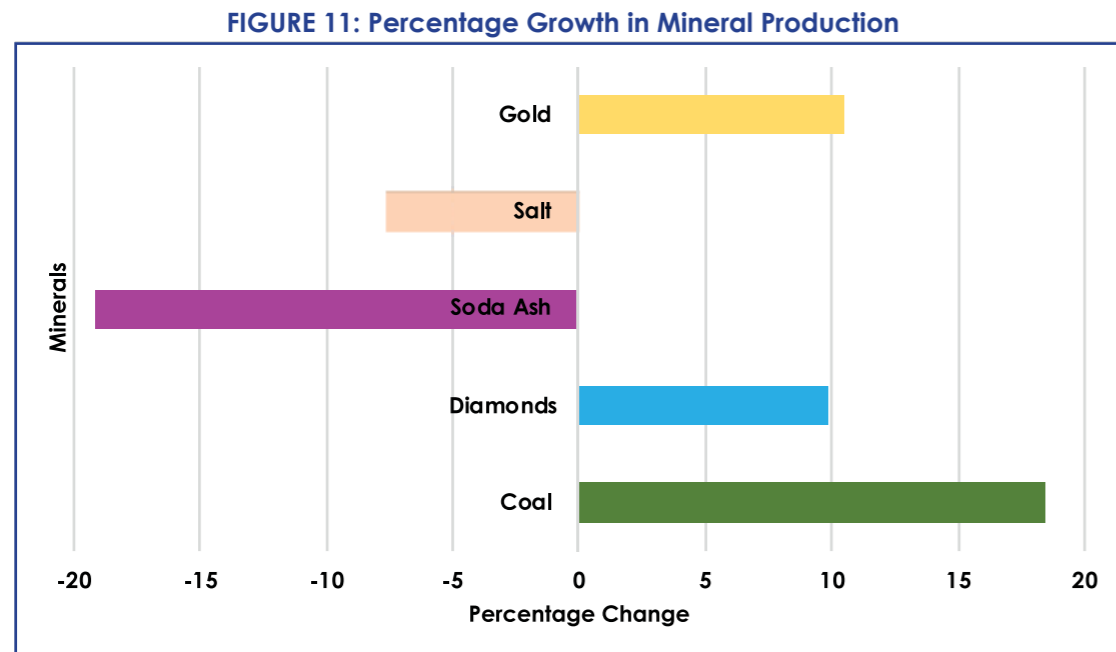
The production levels of minerals in 2017 were as follows; Copper in Concentrates 1,239 tonnes, Coal 2, 215,782 tonnes, Diamonds 22,947 thousand carats, Soda Ash 226,667 tonnes, Salt 369,613 tonnes, Gold 920 KG. Copper Nickel Cobalt Matte and Silver were under provisional liquidation therefore no production for the period.

Coal recorded the highest growth of 18.4 percent followed by Gold and Diamonds with 10.5 percent and 9.8 percent respectively.

Soda Ash and Salt production recorded negative growth of 19.2 and 7.6 percent respectively in 2017. Copper in Concentrates producing mines resurrected in the second quarter of 2017 after being under provisional liquidation since the fourth quarter of 2015.

Copper-Nickel-Cobalt Matte and Silver recorded zero production in 2017.

Figure 11 below illustrates the percentage change in the production of minerals during 2017 compared to 2016.



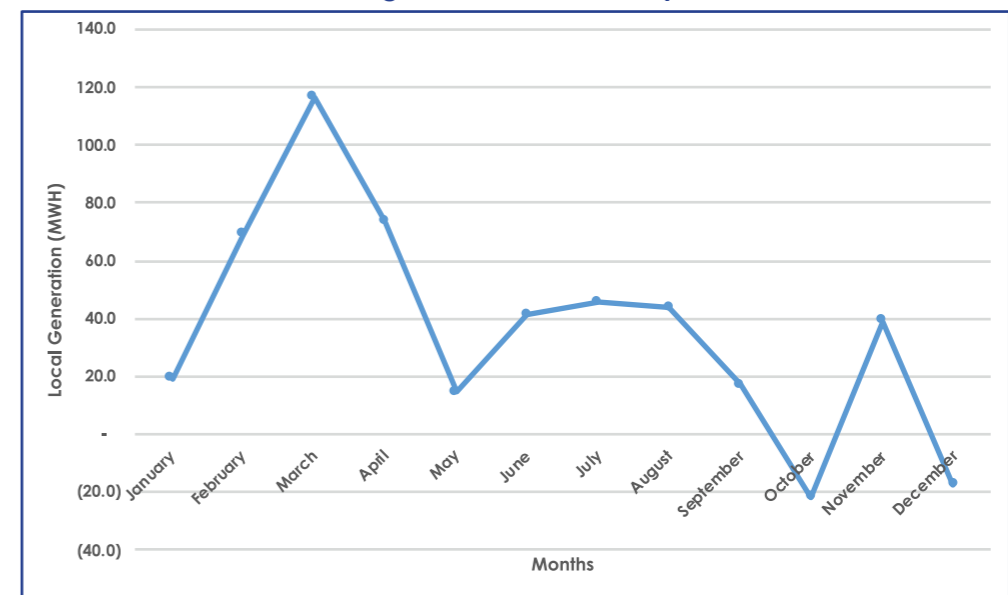
Electricity Generation Statistics

Table D and Figure 12 below present electricity generation in Botswana for period 2014, compared to 2017. It can be observed that in 2017, the electricity generation with the exception of October and December, increased as compared to the same periods in 2016. This increase was attributable to improved performance of Morupule B power station. Though there were observed fluctuations during the period under review, in general, the country experienced an improved electricity generation.

Tourism

Tourist Arrivals

During 2017, Botswana received a total of 1,774,960 visitors, with 91.4 percent (1,622,588) accounted for by tourists (overnight visitors) while 8.6 percent (152,372) was attributed to same-day visitors. The total number of tourists shows a 3.7 percent (62,726) increase compared to 1,712,234 during the previous year.

Purpose of Visit

A significant increase in purpose of entry was observed for those on 'Holiday' at 81.8 percent (225,992) from 276,317 in 2016 to 502,309 currently. Decreases were recorded for 'Visiting Friends and Relatives' and Business at 23.5 percent (93,709) to 398,668 and 21.4 percent (112,117) to 411,980 in 2017, respectively from 492,377 and 524,097 during 2016.

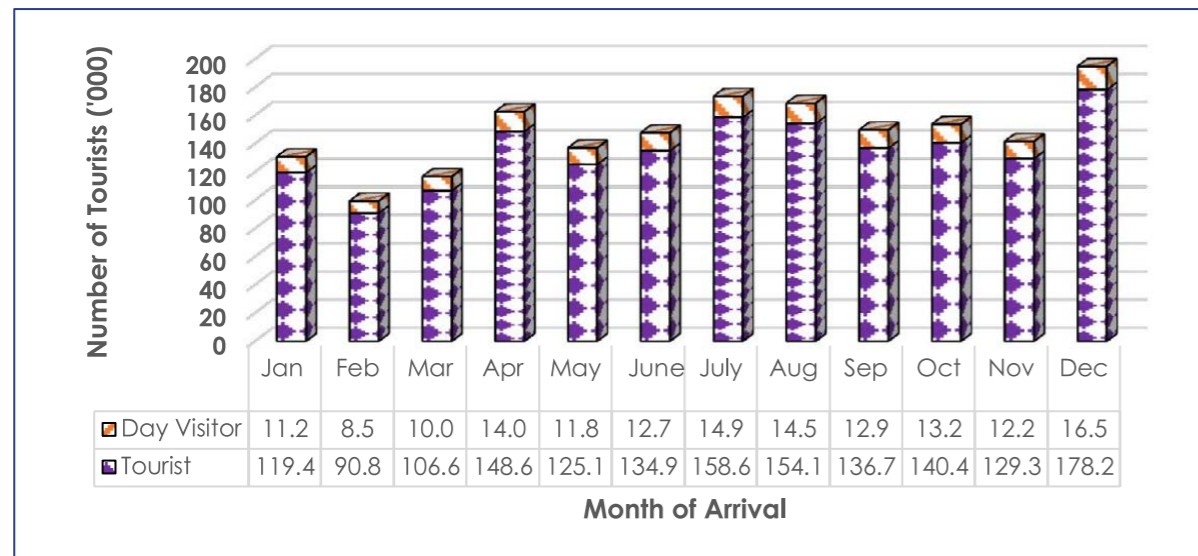
There has been an increase in the number of tourists who came for purposes of "Religious, Conferencing, Sports, Medical & Shopping activities" which are grouped together under one category called 'Other' Purposes. The number of tourists has increased two fold from 63, 007 in 2016 to 156, and 756 in 2017. These tourists represented 8.8 percent of all tourists who came to Botswana during the year under review.

In 2017 most of the Tourists came for Holiday at 28.3 percent (502, 309) followed by those who were on Business at 23.2 percent (411, 980).

Month of Arrival

December month recorded the highest number of tourists at 11.0 percent (194,649) of tourists and followed July and August at 9.8 percent (173,498) and 9.5 percent (168,622) respectively. The least percentage of tourists were recorded in February at 5.6 percent (99,291).

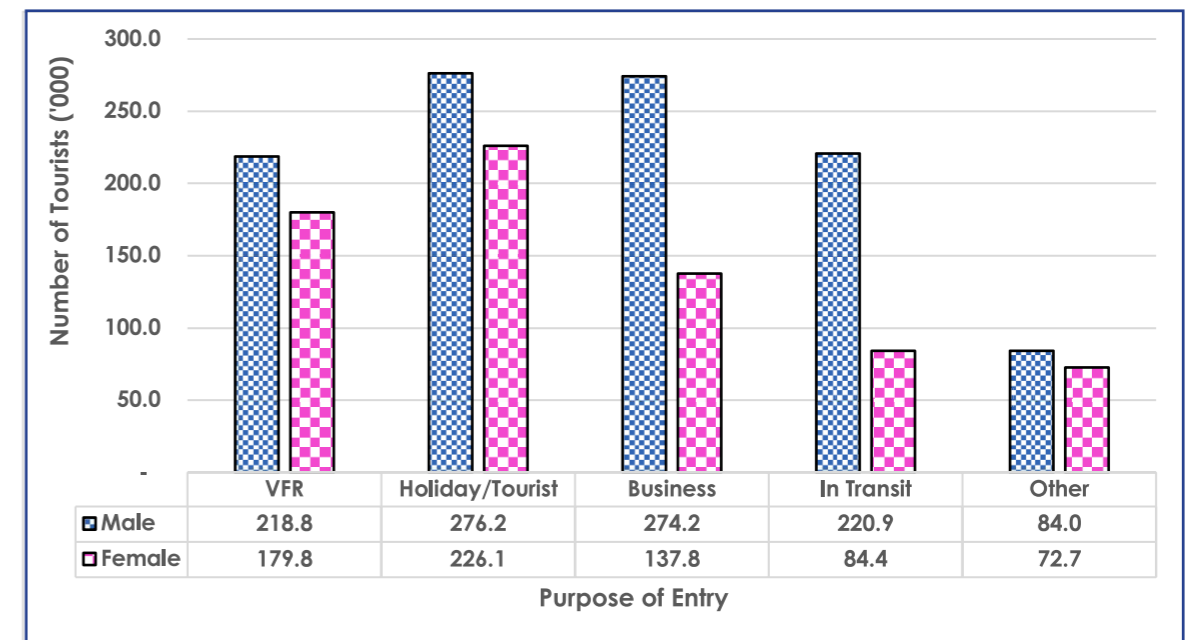
FIGURE 13: Number of tourists by Month of Arrival, 2017



Sex and Purpose of Entry

Most of the males, 25.7 percent (276,221) came for Holiday followed by those who were on Business related activities and those who were In-Transit at 25.5 percent (274,221) and 20.6 percent (220,875) respectively. Most females came for Holiday, 32.3 percent (226, 088) followed by those Visiting Friends and Relatives.

Age Distribution

During 2017, tourists aged 30-34 accounted for 15.1 percent (268, 641) of all tourist arrivals. Tourists aged 19 years and below make up 6.6 percent (116,433) and are mainly children accompanying their parents or the principal visitor/traveler. Those aged 65 years and above make 6.4 percent (113,517) and their main purpose of visit was for Holiday. There is a small number of tourists who their age is not known, accounting for less than 0.1 percent (127) of total tourist arrivals.

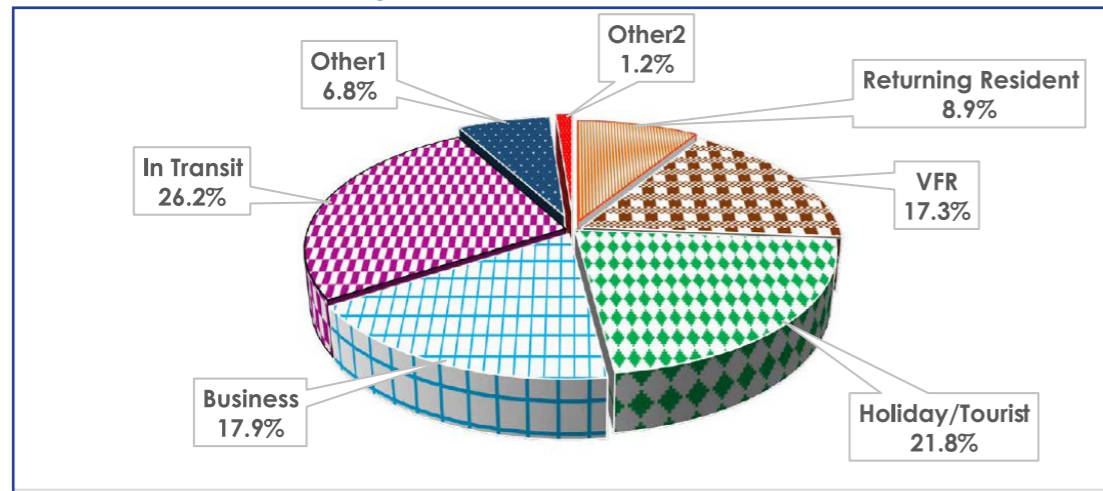

All Travelers by Purpose of Entry

Most of the Arrivals were those In-Transit. They make up 26.2 percent (603, 206) of total Arrivals. These are followed by those who came for Holiday and Business at 21.8 percent (502, 309) and 17.9 percent (411, 980) respectively.

A few arrivals did not state their reason of visit, and these represented 0.1 percent (1,821) of total arrivals (2,305,205). This shows an improvement of 84.3 percent in the completeness of the data as compared to 2016 where 0.5 percent (11,562) of Arrivals (2,401,786) did not state the purpose for their visit.

FIGURE 15: Percentage Distribution of Arrivals by Purpose of Entry - 2017

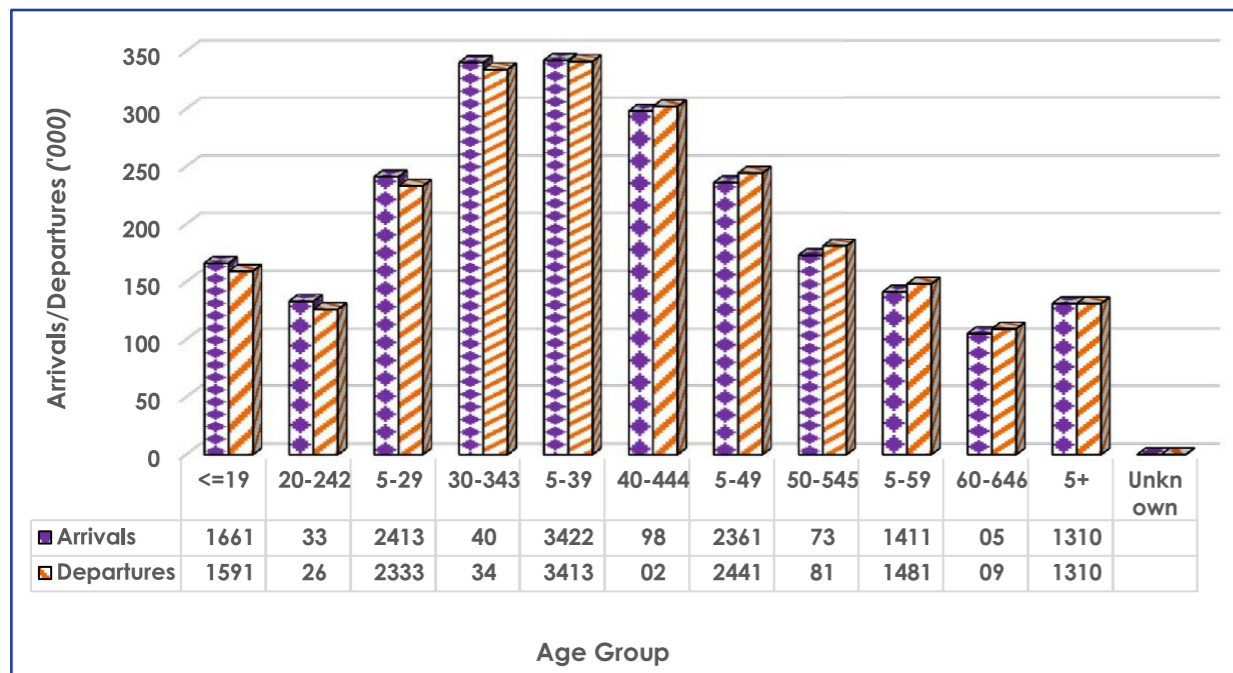


Age Group (all travellers)

The age-groups 35-39 years and 30-34, accounted for 14.8 percent of all arrivals each, at values of 341, 883 and 340, 195 respectively.

The highest proportion of departures during 2017 was in the age-group 35-39 followed by those aged 30-34, at 14.8 percent (341,301) and 14.5 percent (334,032) respectively.

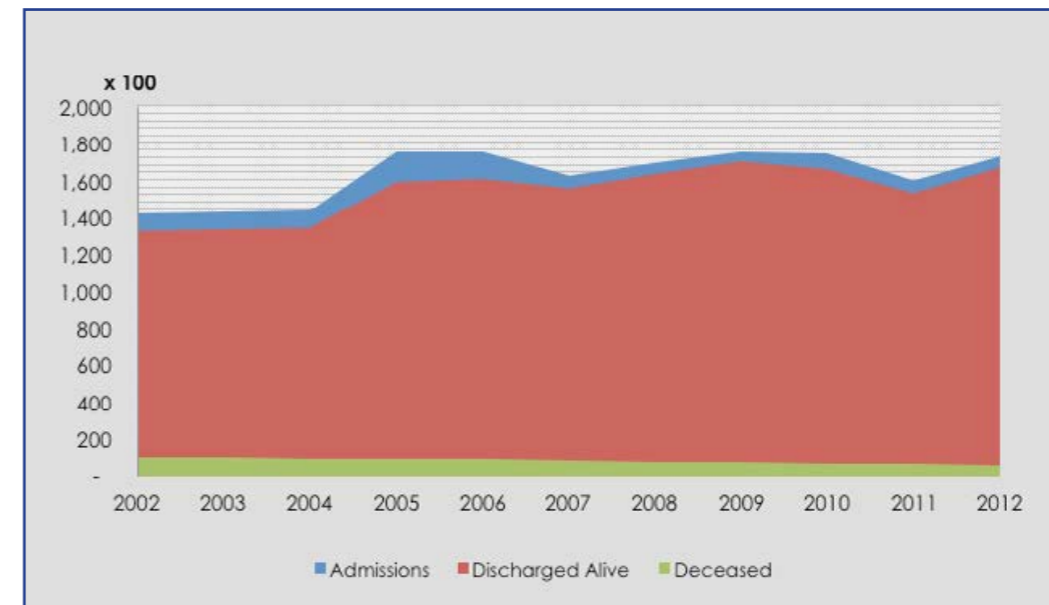
Introduction

The Social Statistics section provides a comprehensive and detailed statistical overview of Botswana's population, Health, Education, Poverty and Labour. The section gives a detailed picture for each statistics area covered in the form of text, tables and graphs.

Health

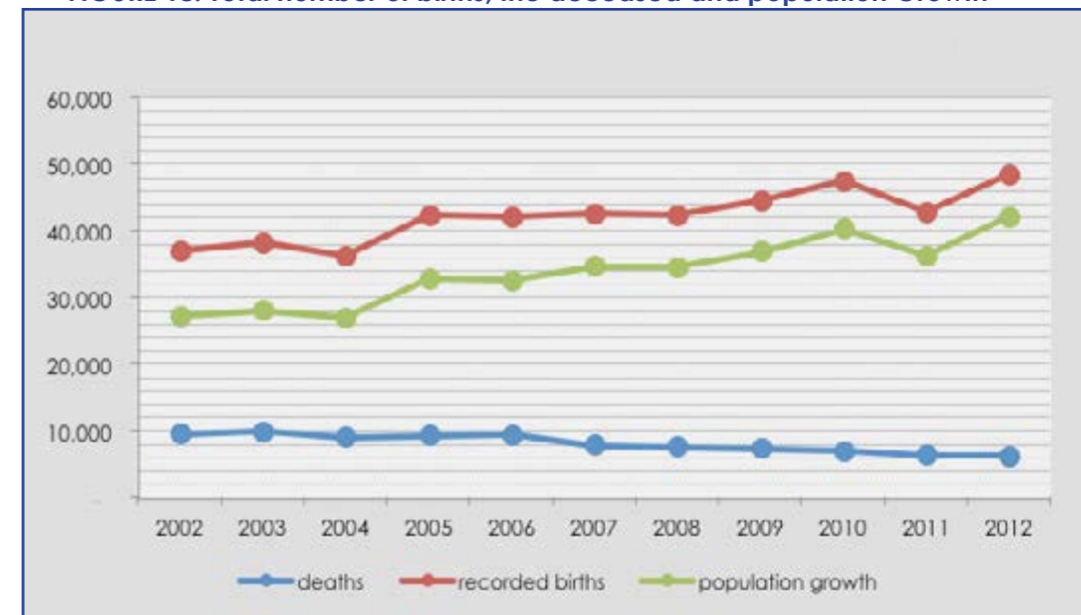
Admissions in health facilities have realized an increase of 8 percent in 2012 over the 159,835 cases recorded in 2011. Proportions of admissions to the deceased in health facilities have generally declined over time. Between 2002 and 2003, approximately 7 per 100 patients admitted to hospitals passed-on whilst the figure is at 4 per 100 admitted patients between 2011 and 2012.

The number of the deceased was recorded at 6, 222 in 2012 compared to 6,537 that was recorded in 2011. Within the same time frame, the number of births increased by 5,559 from 42, 962 births recorded the previous year. Neglecting other factors as migration, the population grew by 42, 299 people in 2012.

The number of patient days has generally increased over time with some notable declines over some periods. Between 2002 and 2012, a peak was realized in 2010 where patient days were at 1,291,609. There was however a decline in the subsequent year by 10.8%. A similar trend was also noted for Bed occupancy rate.

It appears that although the number of beds was increasing between 2002 and 2009, the increase was not adequate to offset the number of days patients spend while admitted. Between 2010 and 2012, an improvement was realized with bed Occupancy approaching the minimum on the reflected time span at 59.6% in 2011.

Education

The official statistics published assist in policy formulation, monitoring and evaluation of the existing education policies, inform sector planning and decision making. Furthermore, the statistics serves as evidence on the country's progress towards meeting national and international obligations and benchmarks on provision of education. Education data covers all levels of education, notably, pre-primary, primary, secondary, technical & vocational, and tertiary.

Education statistics are compiled using data obtained through annual school census, supplemented by administrative data as well as data obtained through household surveys as well as Population and Housing Census.

The table above presents School drop outs for the year 2015, it must be noted that drop outs remains key challenges to free basic education despite the various reasons for dropping out. A decline in drop outs has been noted from the year 2012 to 2013, however, slight increases are notable thereafter for the following years 2014 and 2015 at primary and secondary level.

FIGURE 19: Primary School Enrolment in total: 2009-2014

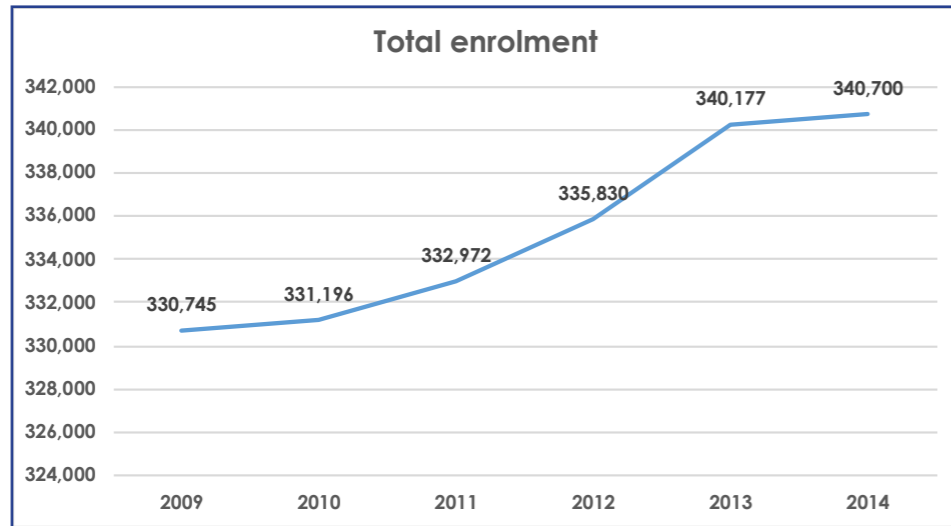


Figure 19 shows that Primary school enrolment has been increasing over the past six years. The enrolment increased from 330,745 in 2009 to 340,700 in 2014.

Figure 20: Percentage of Secondary Schools by School Ownership -2005-2014

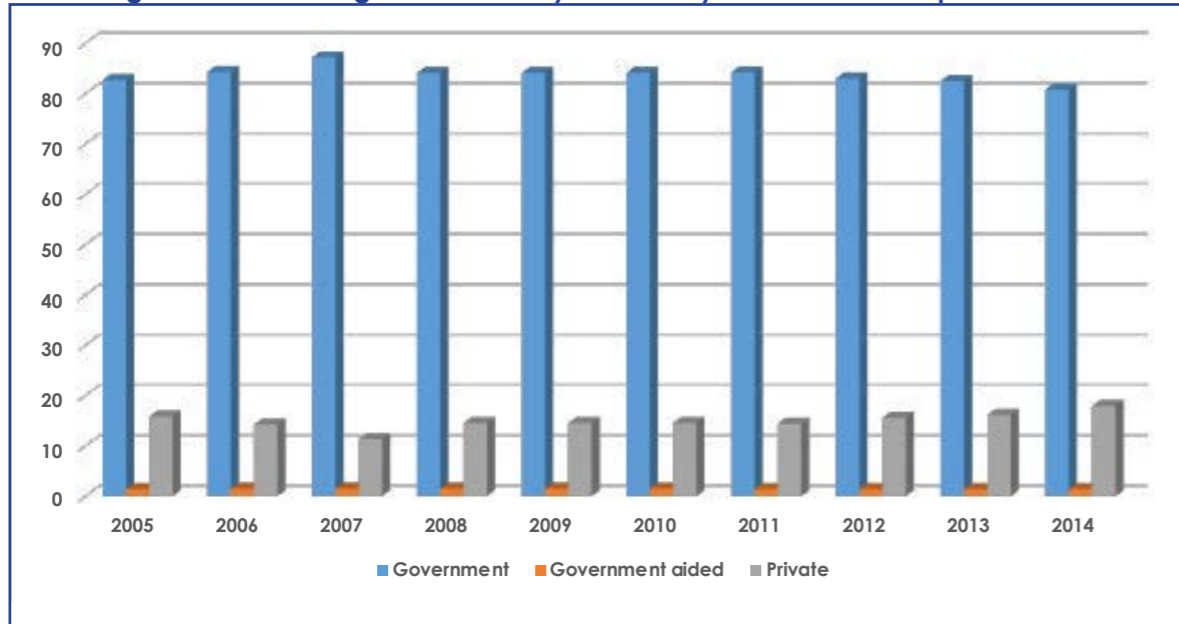


Figure 20 shows that government schools constituted 82.00 percent or more of all schools for the past 10 years. The percentage of government schools increased from 83 percent in 2005 to 87.2 percent in 2007 and thereafter reduced to 82.5 percent in 2013 and 81.8 percent in 2014 due to increase in private schools. On the other hand the percentage of private schools fluctuated between 11.3 and 16.8 percent. The percentage of government aided schools remained around 1.4 percent mainly because the number of schools has remained constant over the years. The graph indicates that government is the main provider of secondary education.

FIGURE 21: Primary School Drop Out Rates by Sex: 2008-2013

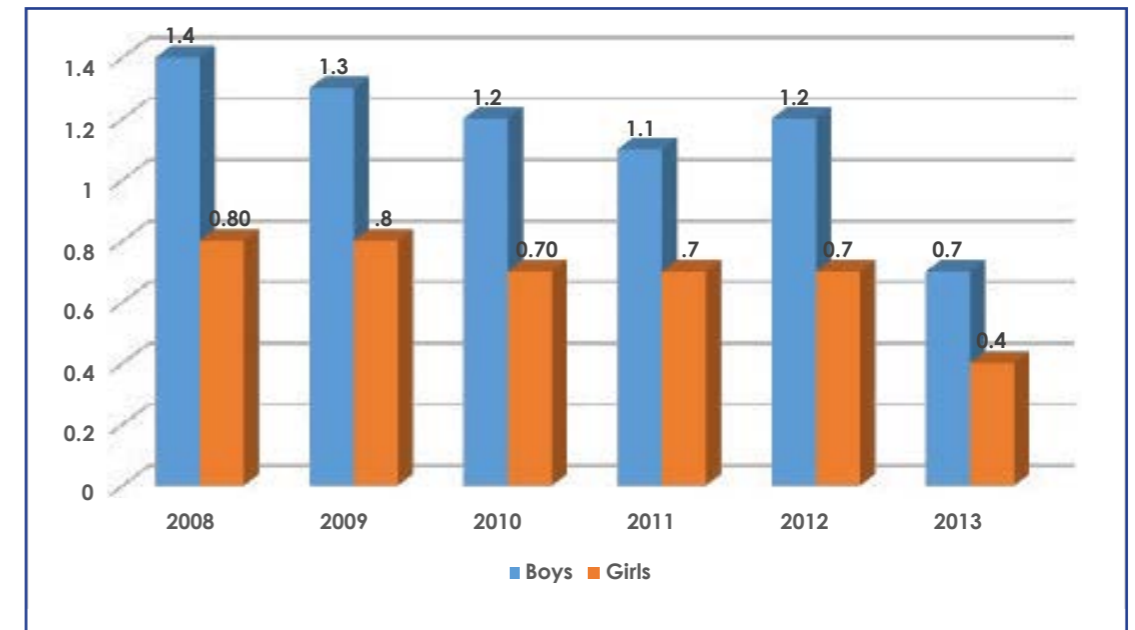


Figure 21 shows that primary school dropout rate reduced from 1.1 percent in 2008 to 0.6 in 2013. The rate for boys reduced from 1.4 percent in 2008 to 0.7 percent in 2013 while the rate for girls reduced from 0.8 percent to 0.4 percent during the same period. Furthermore the analysis shows that primary school boys dropped from school at a higher rate than girls across the years. Generally the school drop out for Primary Education has been dropping down for over the years except for the year 2012 where slight increase was recorded for both sexes.

FIGURE 22: Tertiary Education Gross Enrolment Ratios (TEGER) for Population 18-24 Years- 2003 - 2016

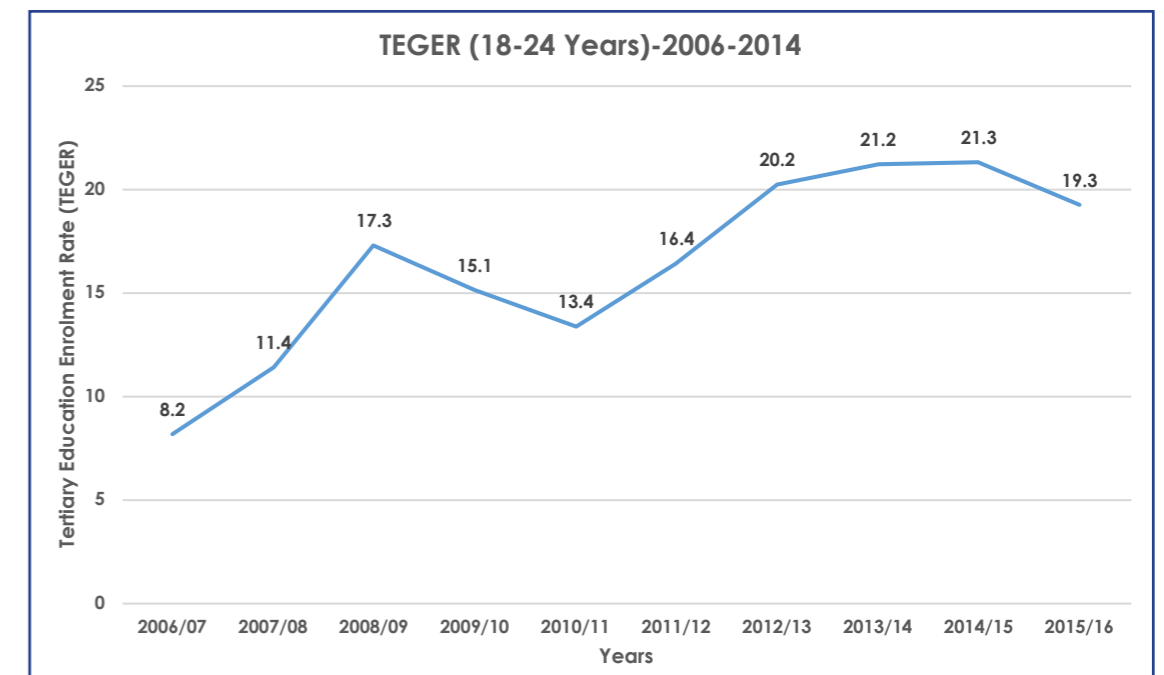


Figure 22 shows that tertiary education gross enrolment ratio (TEGER) for population 18 -24 years steadily increased from 8.2% in 2006 to 21.3% in 2014/15. A slight decrease of 2% was recorded between 2014/15 and 2015/16.

FIGURE 23: Literacy Rate for Population 15-65 Years by Sex – 2014

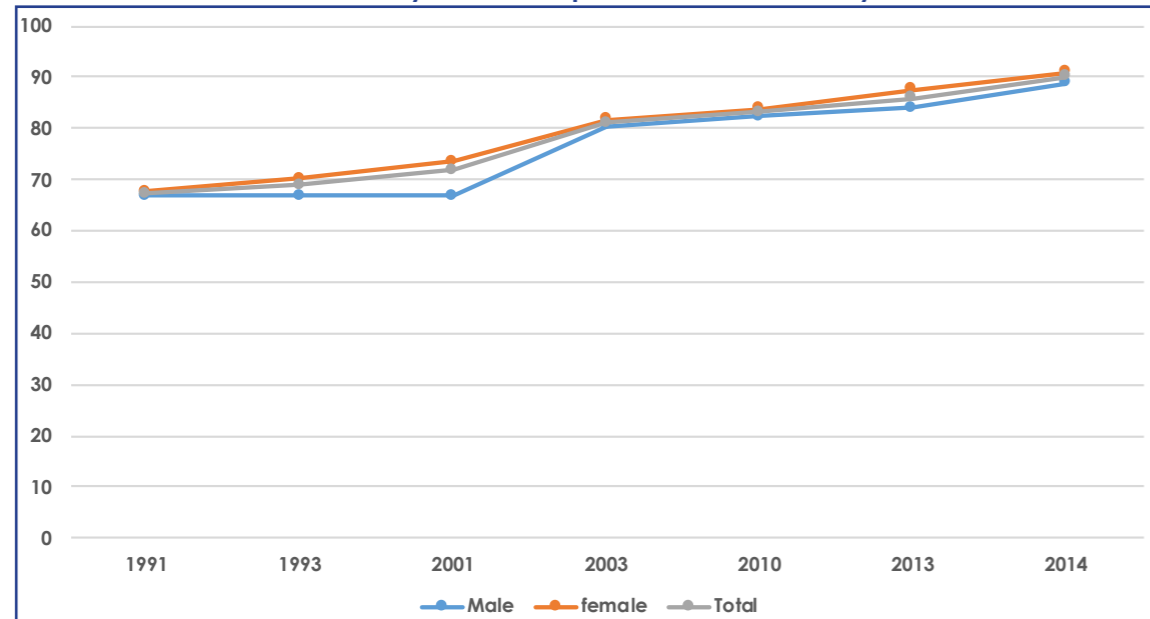

On another note the graph shows that female literacy has been above of that males for all the years. In 1991 the average literacy was below 70 percent, and by 2004 it surpassed the 80 percent mark. It is noted that the literacy rate at 2014 was on the 90 percent mark.
