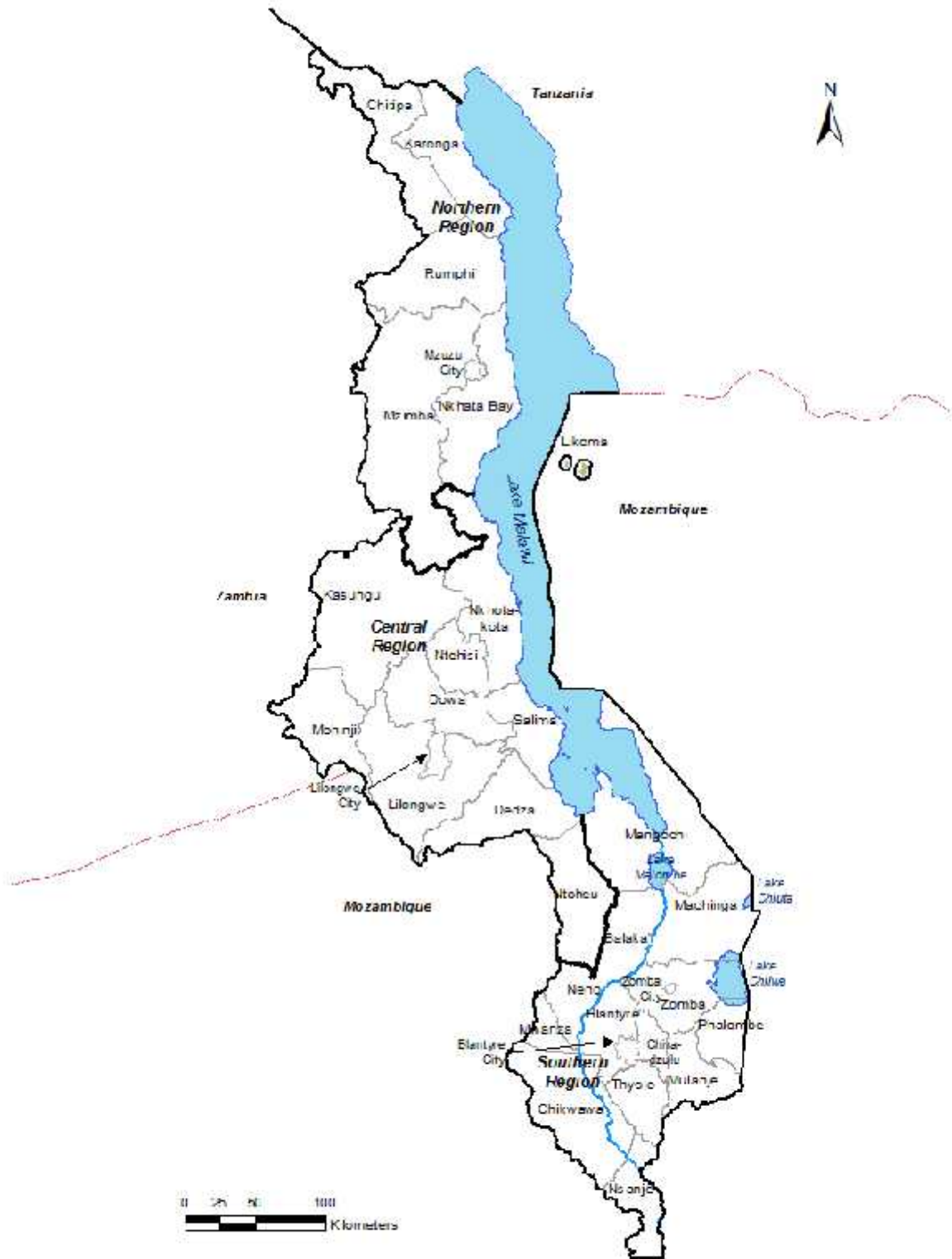
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MAP OF MALAWI

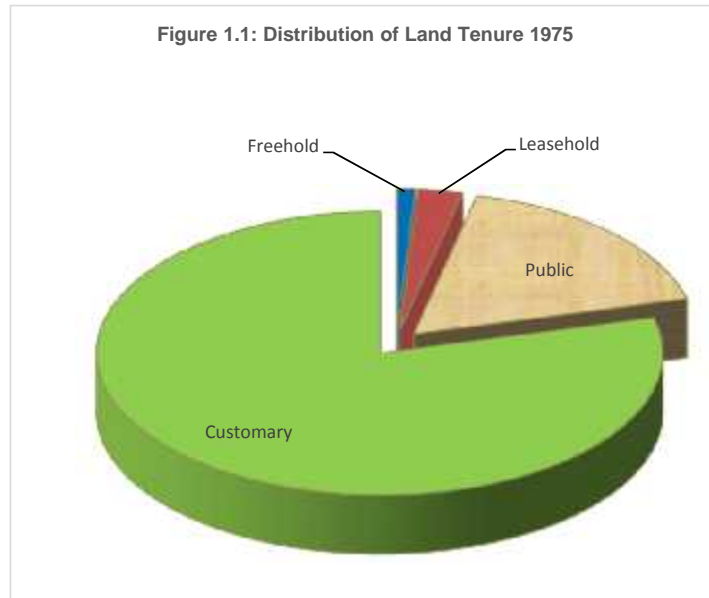

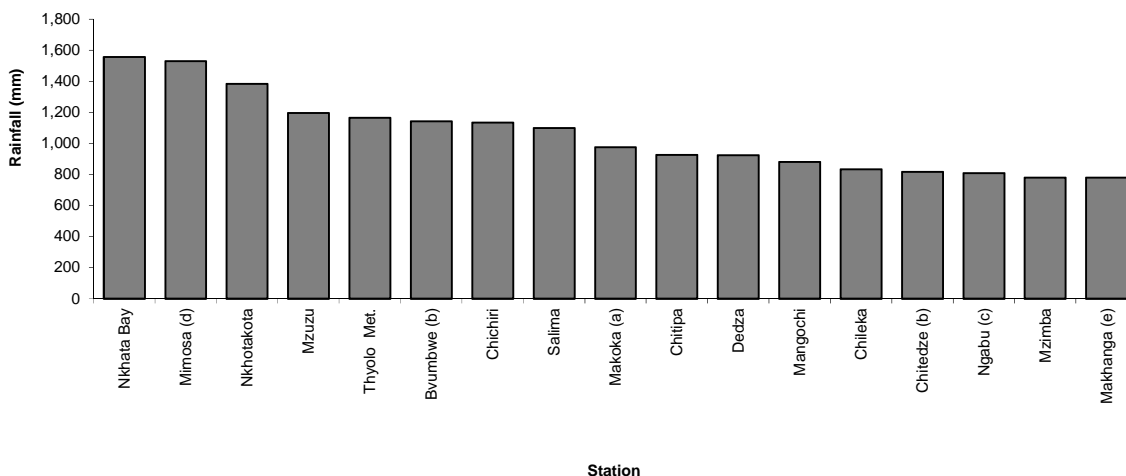

Figure 1.2: Annual Rainfall 2007-2016

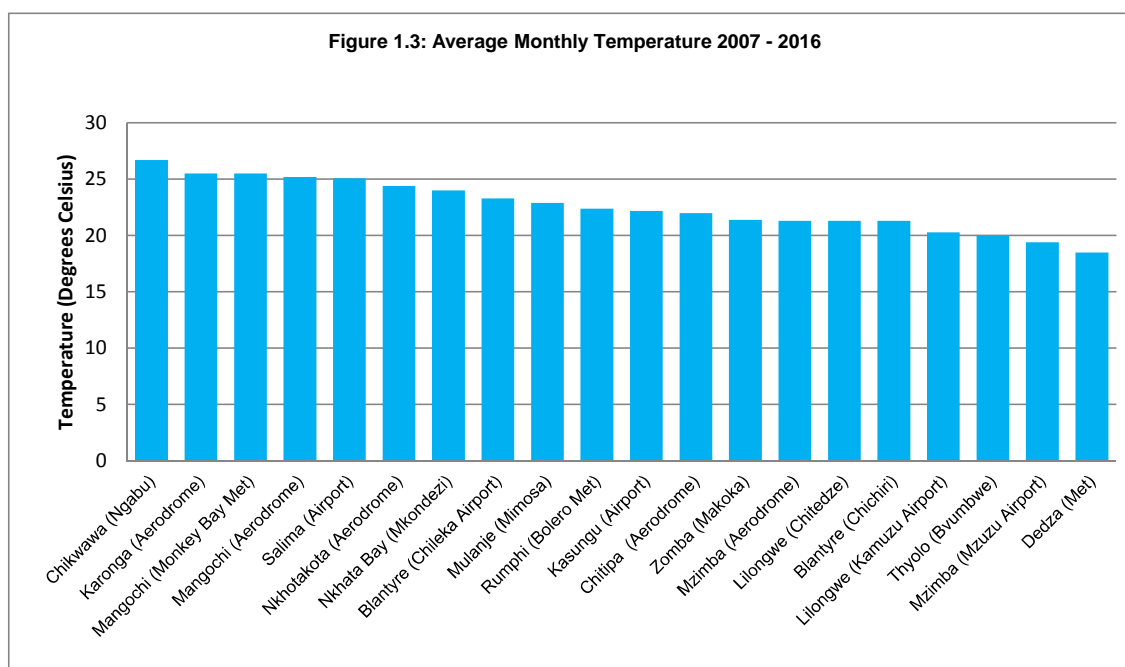

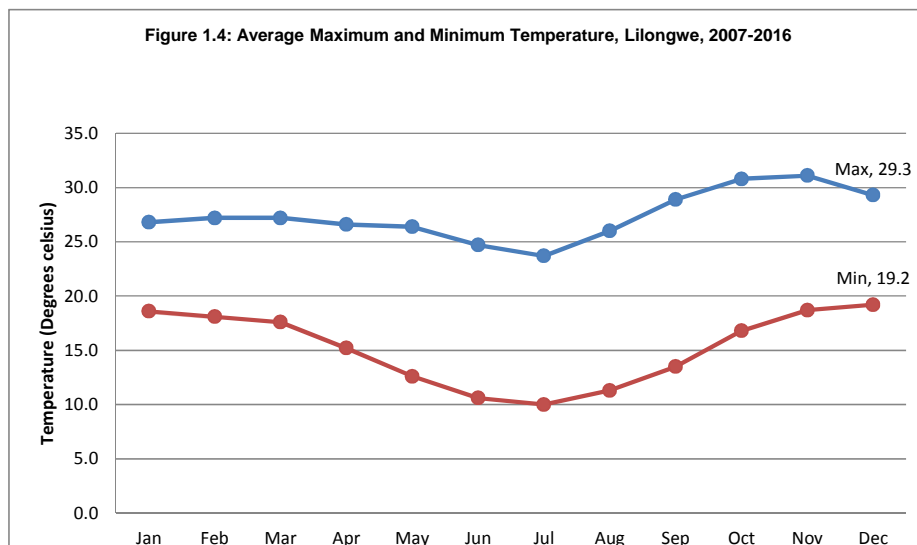

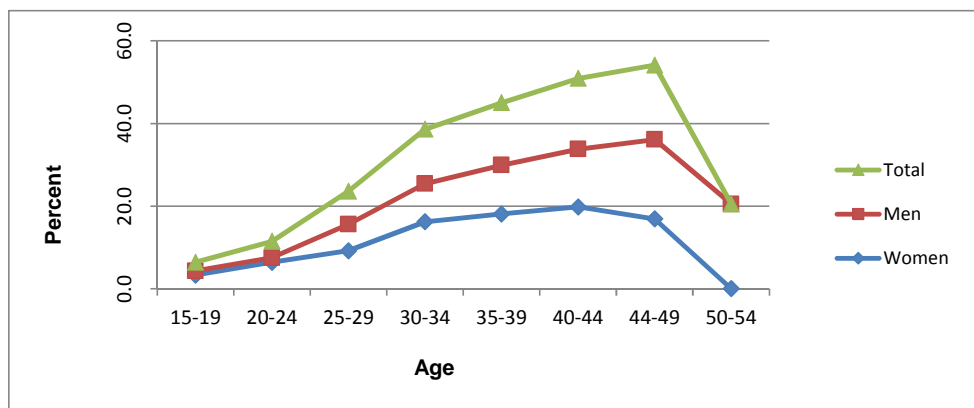

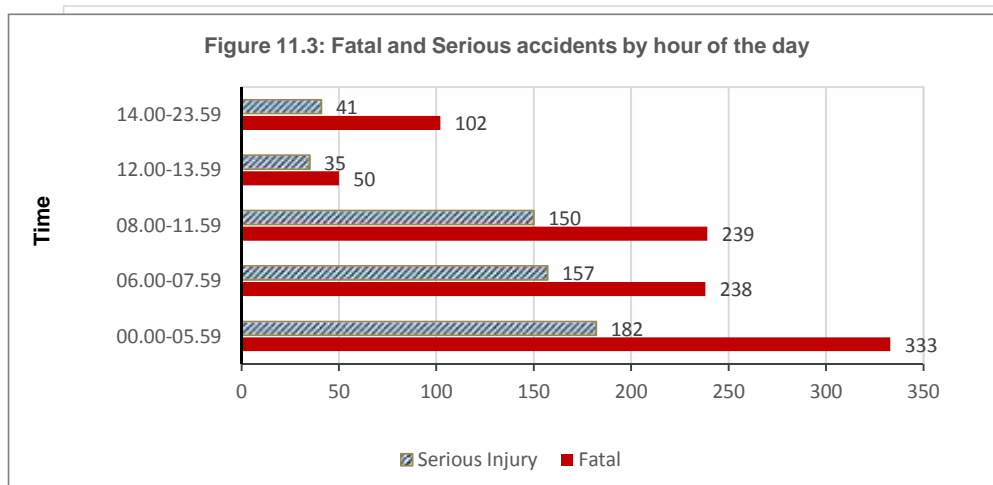

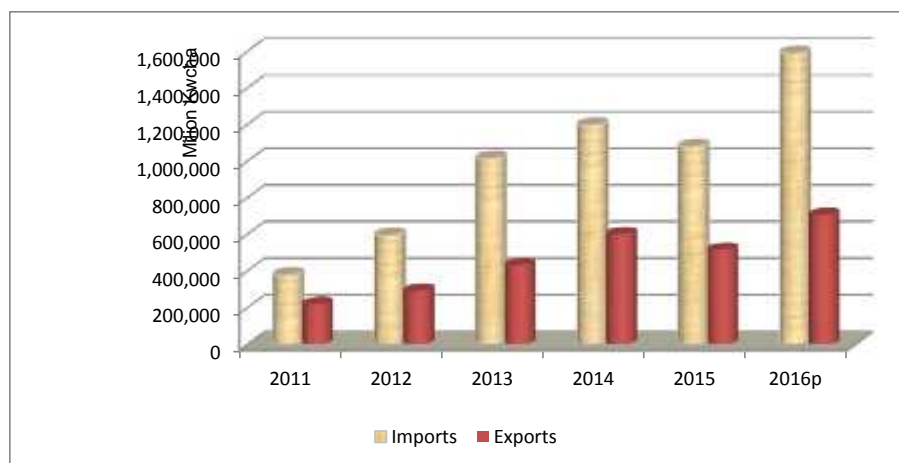

Figure 16.1: Value of Total Imports and Exports

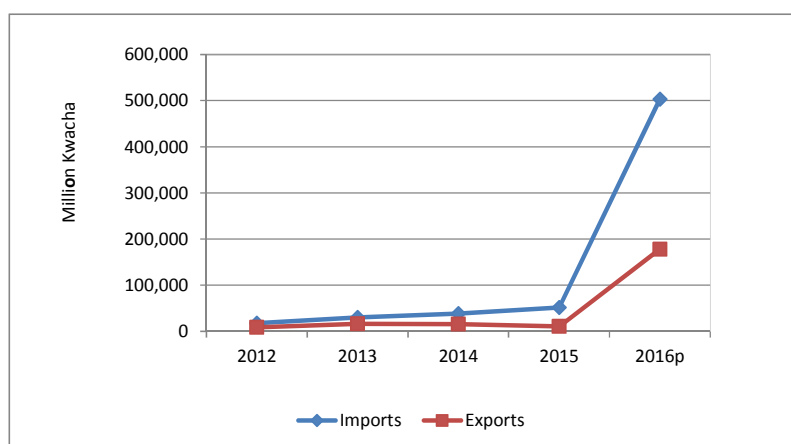

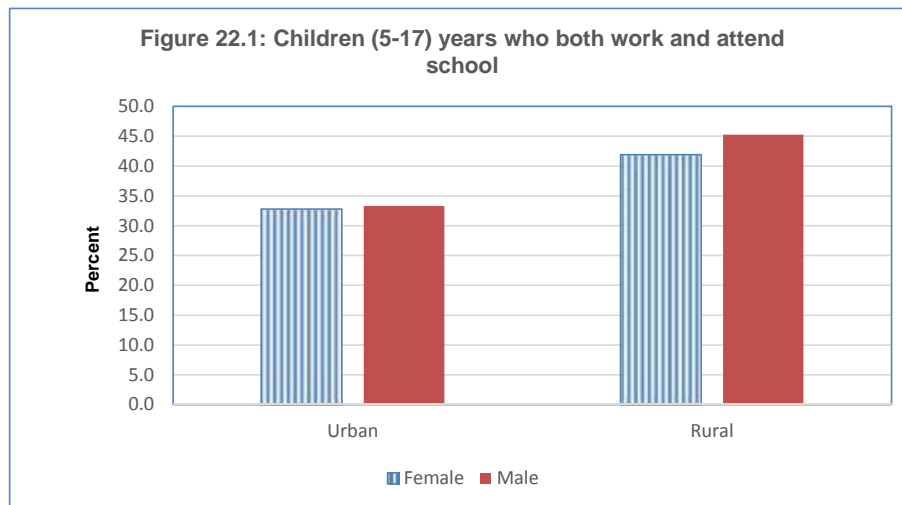
